Wednesday Bible Study 7:00 pm Throughout history mankind has struggled while trying to answer the question, what is truth. Our concern here is with truth that leads to successful devotion to God. As a result, Christians believe the Bible is that source of truth that guides man to a relationship with Him (2 Tim. 3:16, 17; John 17:17 etc.). In other words, all sincere seekers of truth aspire to know God through His written word. However, we do recognize that there are various opinions with regards how one manifest the will (actions) of God. As Christians who believe the Bible is the word of God and the authority for the Church; we believe the scriptures alone confirm our faithfulness to the will of God (Romans 10:17). Experiences can indicate that one's life is being transformed by God but experiences that are authentic correspond with the written word.

It is evident here in **Matthew 15**, that Jesus is troubled by religious leaders who apparently find it acceptable to substitute God's truth with human traditions. The question Jesus poses to the religious leaders alone is not threatening, it simply demands investigation. Why would sincere believers alter God's word by replacing truth with tradition (**1 John 2:3-5**)? Throughout the Bible sincere believers are urged to evaluate what they hear from those who speak for God (**1 John 4:1**). Keeping in mind that when the blind lead the blind, they all fall in the ditch (**Matt. 15:14**). By helping people who are open to process their beliefs, several possibilities become clear. In some instance, people are simply following the traditions of their faith system. We do not question their sincerity but we can help them to evaluate their understanding of God's word. When this is done in a loving and respectful manner, sincere people appreciate learning. Yet, in other instances, when we try the spirit of people who hold to certain views that do not correspond with scripture, we may embark upon resistance.

When resistance to investigating the scriptures is a person's attitude, shake the dust off your feet and "get to step-pin." Only to suggest that Jesus did not call believers in general to go to war with resistors to the truth. Of course the apostles often were challenged by individuals and verbal combat did take place, but those encounters are recorded for our learning. Having the courage to take people to task over their understanding of truth is a burden I believe that is only fit for people who can fight that fight without becoming discouraged and disheartened. No propagator of the gospel seeks opportunities to war with people over truth, there is no enjoyment in such activity. Rather, those who teach God's word seek to help people step out of darkness into the light of God's truth.

When men over time begin to change God's word, usually to satisfy cultural demands or the whims of some ambitious human-being or group, sincere people often get mislead. We are illuminators of God's light. We strive to live the truth to please God and to initiate opportunities to inspire others to follow the light.
